Re: Band Camp 2019 and other important information

Dates: July 28 through August 2 at Bethany College, Bethany, West Virginia. Camp will officially

BEGIN when we leave Louisville High School by bus on Sunday, July 28, at 1:15 p.m. All

students are to report to the band room at 12:15 p.m.

Cost: The cost of the camp will be \$195.00 per student, payable by cash, *credit card (this was new* 

*last year!)*, or check to Louisville Band Boosters. Camp food, available for \$20.00, can also be included with your payment. (There are no places to order food at night, so we provide pizza, ice cream, etc. at the evening activities. *All payments will be collected during your* 

student's uniform fitting.

The cost for pay-to-participate is as follows: (DUE IN THE FINANCE OFFICE ONCE SCHOOL BEGINS)

Band All Year-\$50.00

Marching Band Only-\$25.00 (flags and majorettes who do not play an instrument)

WHAT TO BRING

Rehearsal needs: Instrument, music, lyre, pencils, and other rehearsal equipment (flags, baton,

etc.)

Clothing: Come prepared for all types of weather - include shorts, jacket, long pants,

rain wear, swimsuit, sunglasses, many socks, some kind of a hat, etc...

Bedding: Sheets, blanket, pillow, sleeping bag if preferred. NO SLEEPING ON BARE

MATTRESS. All suites have 4 double beds.

Shoes: At least 2 pairs of comfortable shoes suitable for marching

Sundries: Toothbrush, toothpaste, comb, brush, washcloth, towels, soap, sunglasses,

sunscreen, etc.

All Liquids Must Be In Plastic Bottles.

Recreation Articles: Swimsuit, racquet ball equipment, etc...

Money: Large amounts of money are not advisable. Food in the evenings will be

provided at a cost of no more than \$20.00 for the week.

Misc: Bring a key chain or chain for around your neck to keep your room key. A

lost room key will cost you \$100.00.

Identification: For your own protection, we recommend permanent identification on all

personal property.

Housing: We will be staying in Campbell Village I and II, modern dormitories in which

each room accommodates four people. Each suite has a kitchen, living room,

4 bedrooms and 2 bathrooms.

## CAMP RULES

Please keep in mind that the rules for the camp are designed for your well-being and that you are personally responsible, both morally and financially, for your actions. We will not allow any individual or small group of students to spoil the camp experience for other band members.

CONDUCT: Discipline problems will not be tolerated and the offending student may be sent

home immediately. ALL SCHOOL RULES APPLY. No tobacco, alcohol, or drugs will be permitted. No guns, firearms, or firecrackers will be permitted.

LEAVING CAMPUS: No student will leave the campus except for band related business or

emergencies and then only when accompanied by a staff member.

PHONE CALLS: Students will not be called to the phone during rehearsal hours except for

emergencies.

No public phones are available.

You will be expected to pay for any damage incurred to the facilities or equipment.

You must respect the personal property of others.

All students must ride the busses to and from camp.

No girls on boys' floors and no boys on girls' floors at any time for any reason, with the exception of the 1st Floor Lounge. Socializing in public places will only be allowed.

Rooms must be kept clean and neat.

Furniture placed in rooms must remain in that room.

Lights out at 11:00 p.m.

Attendance is mandatory at all rehearsals and planned activities.

Be present at all meals, including breakfast. All students must report in proper dress. (shoes must be worn, no swimsuits).

Shoes must be worn at all times.

Please refer to the Louisville High School Bullying and Hazing Policy below:

#### **BULLYING AND HAZING POLICY**

Hazing means doing any act or coercing another, including the victim, to do any act of intimidation or harassment to any student or other organization that causes or creates a substantial risk of causing mental or physical harm to any person.

Bullying is an intentional written, verbal or physical act that a student has exhibited toward another particular student more than once. The behavior causes both mental or physical harm to the other student and is sufficiently severe, persistent or pervasive that it creates an intimidating, threatening or abusive educational environment for the other student.

Permission, consent or assumption of risk by an individual subjected to hazing and/or bullying does not lessen the prohibition contained in this policy.

Prohibited activities of any type, including those activities engaged in via computer and/or electronic communications devices, are inconsistent with the educational process and are prohibited at all times. No administrator, teacher or other employee of the District shall encourage, permit, condone or tolerate any hazing and/or bullying activities. No student, including leaders of student organizations, is permitted to plan, encourage or engage in any hazing and/or bullying.

Administrators, teachers and all other District employees are particularly alert to possible conditions, circumstances or events that might include hazing and/or bullying. If hazing and/or bullying or planned hazing and/or bullying is discovered, involved students are informed by the discovering District employee of the prohibition contained in this policy and are required to end all hazing and/or bullying activities immediately. All hazing and/or bullying incidents are reported immediately to the Superintendent and appropriate discipline is administered.

The Superintendent/designee must provide the Board President with a semiannual written report of all verified incidents of hazing and/or bullying and post the report on the District's website.

The administration provides training on the District's hazing and bullying policy to District employees and volunteers who have direct contact with students. Additional training is provided to elementary employees in violence and substance abuse prevention and positive youth development.

District employees, students and volunteers have qualified civil immunity for damages arising from reporting an incident of hazing and/or bullying. Administrators, teachers, other employees and students who fail to abide by this policy may be subject to disciplinary action and may be liable for civil and criminal penalties in compliance with State and Federal law.

No one is permitted to retaliate against an employee or student because he/she files a grievance or assists or participates in an investigation, proceeding or hearing regarding the charge of hazing and/or bullying of an individual.

## **OTHER INFORMATION**

Directions from Louisville: Travel SR 44 south to East Canton, go east on Rt. 30 to Lisbon. Take 11 South to East Liverpool and exit on Rt. 7 South. Follow Rt. 7 to Steubenville and get on Rt. 22 East and merge onto Rt. 2 South for 9 miles and then turn left onto Rt. 67. Bethany College will be approx. 7 miles.

## **OTHER GENERAL INFORMATION**

#### **OFFICIAL BAND SHORTS**

The official LHS Band Shorts must be purchased at Beatty's Sport Shop in Louisville. The shorts are \$10.00. All new members must buy their shorts by July 27 from Beatty's so that they will be ready to take to Band Camp. The summer uniform is worn for a Friday morning performance at camp, at the band preview, and under the regular uniform. Flag corps members and majorettes also need to purchase these shorts.

SOCKS A black crew sock is to be worn with the uniform.

#### **BAND SHOES**

All new band members must use the same leather marching shoe. The price for the shoes will be \$40.00 for winds and percussion, \$35.00 for the flags and majorettes, and can be paid at the uniform fitting. Make checks payable to Louisville Band Boosters.

#### **UNIFORMS**

All students will be fitted and/or measured for concert uniforms on the evenings of July 23-25. Incoming freshman will be fit for a marching uniform and measured for a concert uniform. A \$20.00 marching uniform fee is required. The fee includes gloves, raincoat cleaning, uniform cleaning, and band t-shirt. The flag and majorette uniform fee is \$10.00 and includes the band t-shirt. *Students* who are enrolled in Concert Band only do not need to pay the marching uniform fee.
